

The CAS course «**Shaping Europe. Legal, Economic and Political Factors**» is offered as a two-week intensive program. In this course, we will couple recent research with insights from analysts operating close to the centres of action. An intensive simulation of negotiation processes in the EU will further help participants gain an insider view of the practical challenges that there are for reaching solutions to these European problems.
