What drives the research of Europe globally? Researching and teaching Europe is not entirely concentrated in Europe or in the United States. Centers for European studies are active around the globe, from Beijing to Belo Horizonte. While this is not entirely surprising, it still raises the question: what determines the interest in European studies outside of Europe? Is research on Europe at all politicized and, if it is, which factors matter? Is there a role played by the European Union in strengthening the research of Europe around the globe and to which extent is knowledge of Europe determined by domestic factors? These questions are tackled as part of a workshop on the politicization of European Studies in Asia. The workshop takes place in the Institute for European Global Studies at the University of Basel.
