



Visiting Fellowship 2025 – Call for Applications

Thematic focus: International Economics

The EuropaInstitut / Institute for European Global Studies of the University of Basel (Switzerland) welcomes applications for a visiting fellowship (up to 3 months) between September and December 2025. The thematic focus for this year's fellowship is on international economics, with specific expertise in international trade, European integration or international macroeconomics. An additional research interest in interdisciplinary areas such as Economic History or Law and Economics is welcome but not a requirement.

The EuropaInstitut is an interdisciplinary institution linked to three Faculties: Humanities and Social Sciences, Law, and Business and Economics. The aim of the Katekisama Visiting Fellows program is to explore interdisciplinary ways of thinking and to intensify global academic networking, mobility, digital connectivity and inter-university collaboration. The international and interdisciplinary focus of the institute is geared towards researchers who are investigating, understanding and responding to global challenges. This year's Fellowship is intended to promote exchange with colleagues in the Faculty of Business and Economics.

The fellowship is intended for mid-career researchers. Prospective fellows must have completed their doctorate at the time of application and have a proven track record with good international publications in the indicated thematic area. The proposed research project should make an innovative contribution to the fellow's field of expertise and ideally demonstrate an openness to exploring interdisciplinary perspectives. We strongly encourage women scholars to apply. The fellowship includes a grant for travel, accommodation and living expenses in Basel. Fellows are expected to contribute a short teaching event (for instance a seminar for Master's students) and to carry out a presentation of their research activities in Basel.
